Time Trends – All Respondents

Methodology Note:

Findings for April 2022 are based on a survey of 1,591 California adult residents, conducted online using the Ipsos KnowledgePanel. Interviews were conducted in English, Spanish, Chinese (simplified or traditional), Korean, and Vietnamese according to the respondents' preferences. The median time to complete the survey was 20.2 minutes. Interviews were completed from March 30–April 13, 2022.

The sampling error for April 2022, taking design effects from weighting into consideration, is ± 3.3 percent at the 95 percent confidence level for the total unweighted sample of 1,591 adults. This means that 95 times out of 100, the results will be within 3.3 percentage points of what they would be if all adults in California were interviewed. It is ± 6.1 percent for the 424 parents, ± 6.9 percent for the 342 parents of school-age children, and ± 7.2 percent for the 307 public school parents. Sampling error is only one type of error to which surveys are subject. Results may also be affected by factors such as question wording, question order, and survey timing.
