## Californians and Their Economic Well-Being November 2021

#### Time Trends – California Adults Earning Less Than \$40,000 Only

#### Methodology Note:

Findings for November 2021 are based on a survey of 2,292 California adult residents, conducted online using the Ipsos KnowledgePanel. Interviews were conducted in English, Spanish, Chinese (simplified or traditional), Vietnamese, and Korean according to the respondents' preferences. The median time to complete the survey was 16.2 minutes. Interviewing took place from October 12–31, 2021.

The November 2021 sampling error for the 1,027 California adults earning less than \$40,000 annually, taking design effects from weighting into consideration, is  $\pm 5$  percent. Sampling error is only one type of error to which surveys are subject. Results may also be affected by factors such as question wording, question order, and survey timing.

Note: This document only includes data from the 2020 and 2021 Californians and Their Economic Well-Being surveys given there was an oversample of lower-income Californians in each survey. If you have further questions on this, please see the survey methodology for each survey.
