World Mission Sunday

Mission Sunday is celebrated by every Church worldwide, including the poorest. This special Sunday gives us the opportunity to unite with our missionary sisters and brothers overseas, and to recommit ourselves to bringing the Joy of the Gospel to everyone we meet in our daily lives at home and at work. The Mission Sunday collection is made available to be distributed to as many as 1,100 young Churches who are supported by the generosity of Churches that have been blessed with a greater quantity of financial and material gifts. Contributions will be used to build simple mission churches, to educate seminarians as well as female religious novices. Your support also assists in the formation of catechists and lay leaders. The Mission Sunday gift may also be used for building health facilities for children and adults as well as for providing emergency aid in times of war or natural disaster or to assist missionaries in their efforts to care for refugees. The theme for Mission Sunday 2016 is 'Every Christian is a Missionary of Mercy' On Mission Sunday which takes place next Sunday 23rd October, in a special way, we celebrate the work circa 1,300 Irish born missionaries and all missionaries throughout the world. We thank God for them, for all who support them in our own country and during mission month we unite ourselves in prayer with them and with the communities with whom they work.
